## Tips for Rooting

Take a cutting six or more inches long. Remove the lower leaves before putting it in the rooter bulb filled with water. Well water not recommended. Your cuttings will root best in a window with indirect sunlight. Once roots develop you can transplant your cutting to soil or keep them in your ROOTS plant rooter where they will continue to grow. Excessive roots should be trimmed to fit inside the bulb. Water must be changed as soon as you see it become cloudy. If glass should become dirty, remove plant and fill glass with room temperature water and a denture cleaning tablet or vinegar & water. Rinse well with clean water before returning plant to class ROOTS bulb. *Do not use any brush or cleaning utensil in attempt to clean your ROOTS bulb.* 

## Almost all plants will root in a ROOTS Plant Rooter including:

- All variety of Ivy Herbs
- Herbs Spider Plants
- Philodendron
  - Coleus African violets
- Impatiens
- Even Christmas Cactus!


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## Directions

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
Carefully unwrap your FRAGILE ROOTS bulb. They can and will break if not careful, replacement bulbs are available on our website, *plantrooters.com*. The webiste is imprinted on the wooden base if the instruction sheet or business card has been misplaced.





Hold bulb by wooden base. Place bottom hole of wooden base on spike prong. Push hole securely on prong with twisting motion.

Fill with Water.



Take a cutting 6 or more inches long (cut just below leaf joint) remove lower leaves before putting cutting into bulb. As your clipping grows wrap the growth around the frame.
